HISTORY OF SERVE DEI AT THE WELL

From the very beginning The Well has understood the need to take the gospel into our city in real and tangible ways. The story of the woman at the well in John 4 reminds us that Jesus was always very concerned about meeting the physical need (water) and the spiritual need (himself) of those in his community.

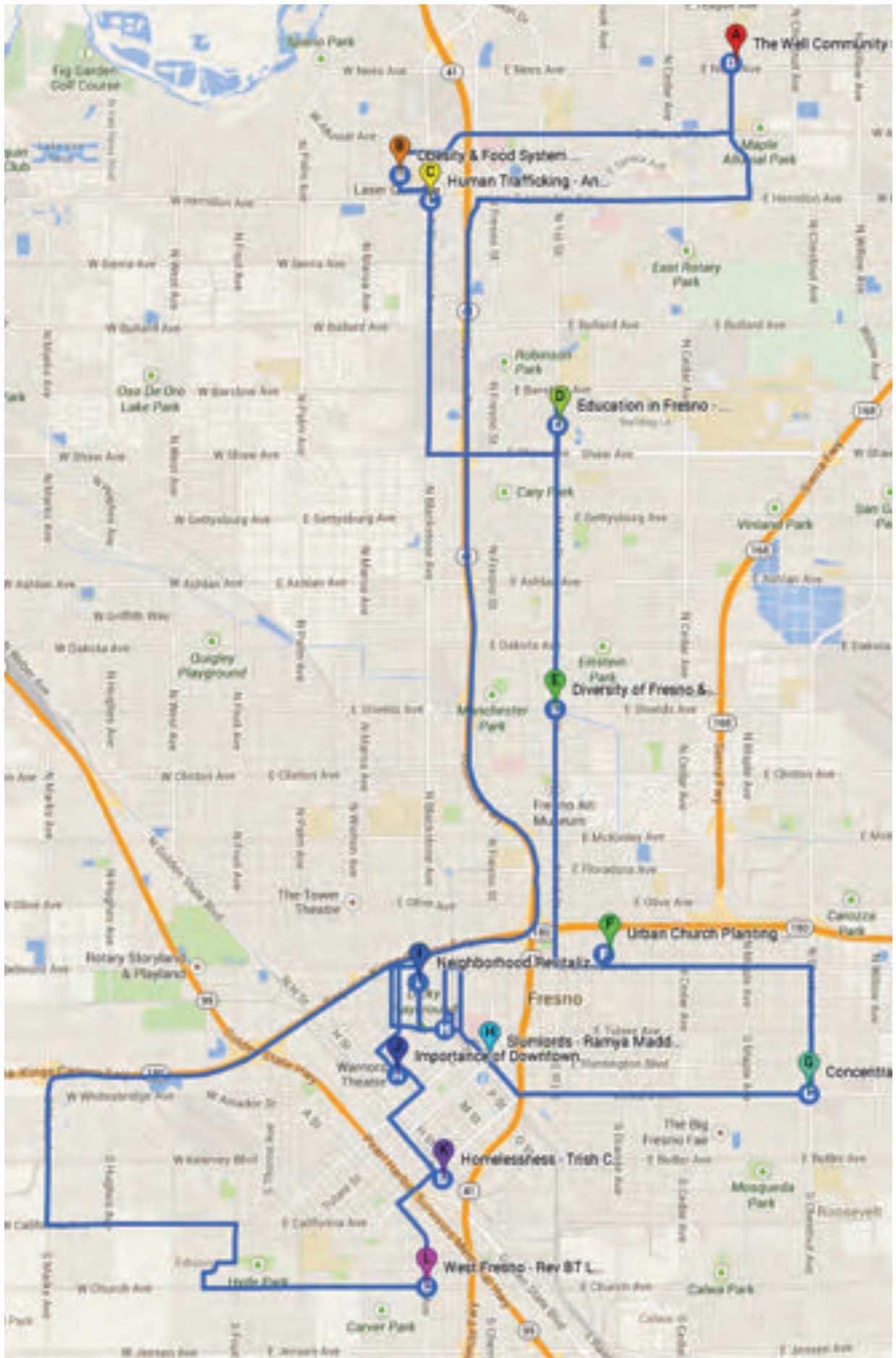
Serve Dei has become an ever evolving and changing way of engaging our city as a corporate church. It has gone through about three different evolutions: **1)** Staff led, **2)** Individual, **3)** Life Group led. Back in 2008, The Well staff planned the first, "Serve Day." The goal was to gather in one location and serve our community, so we all met at Susan B. Elementary in the Tower District and participated in one big serve project at the school.

After a couple years we felt like we wanted to challenge the members of The Well individually to consider what God would call them to. So instead of a big event we gave \$5 to every member of The Well and encouraged them to ask God how He could multiply their funds (like loaves

and fishes) and use them with those that they were around. Instead of serving on a particular day we wanted to teach the fact that we were always called to serve God. We changed the name to Serve Dei (Dei = Latin for God) and used the tagline, "Moving from a day to a lifestyle." We had some amazing stories that you can read here (servedei.com). Last year was the start of another evolution of Serve Dei.

Since our Life Groups had really begun to understand and live out God's heart for our city we realized we were in a place to let them lead the charge for Serve Dei. We challenged each Life Group to participate by finding a need, partnering with a non-profit, or looking for ways to serve. It became a missional event for the church. They took the lead and we watched in amazement at the variety, passion and ideas Life Groups came up with. As we sit on the planning stages of Serve Dei 2014 we are looking to cement and grow in what we did last year. We know that God wants to use His church in our city to point others to the love and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ!

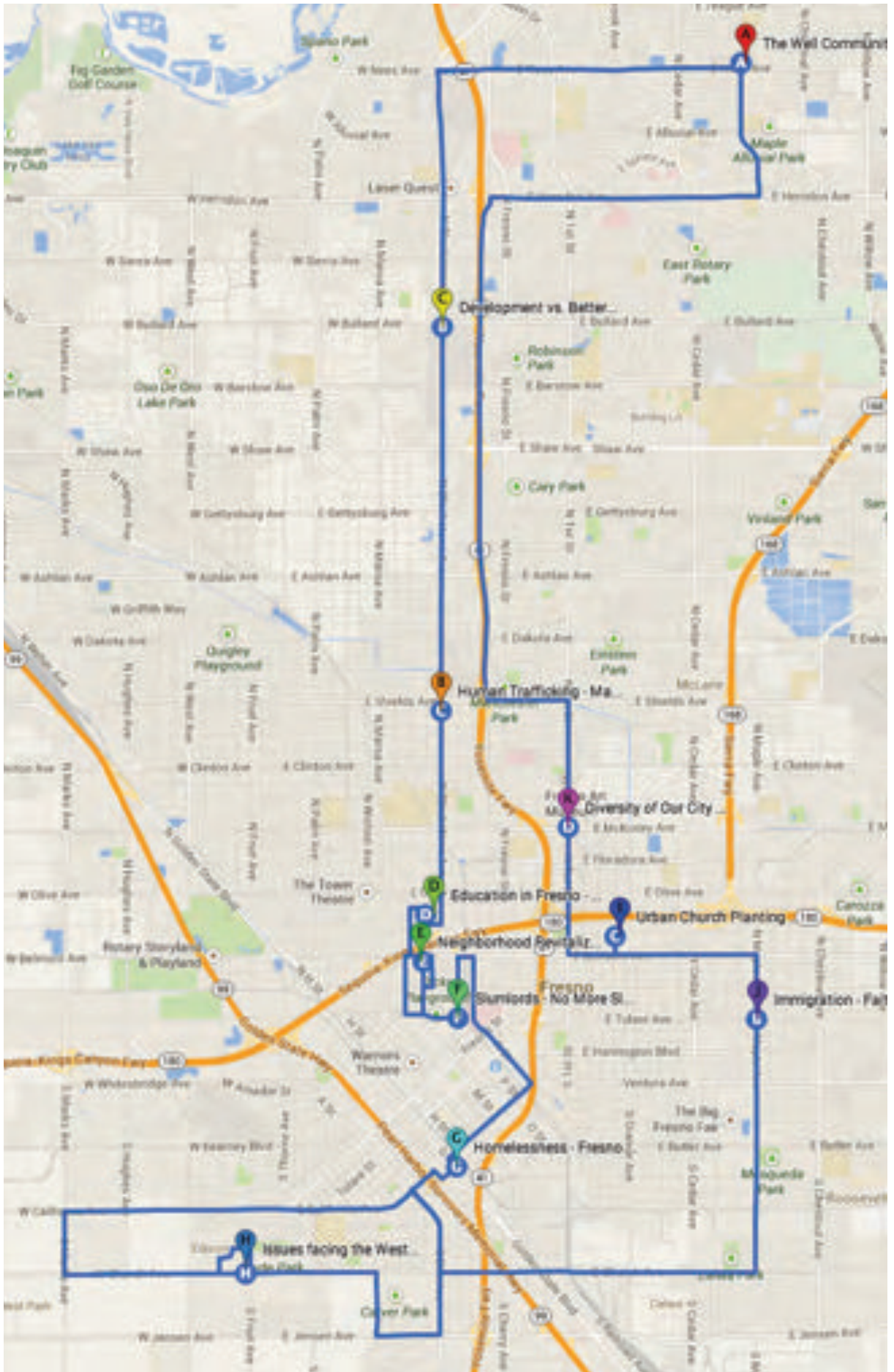

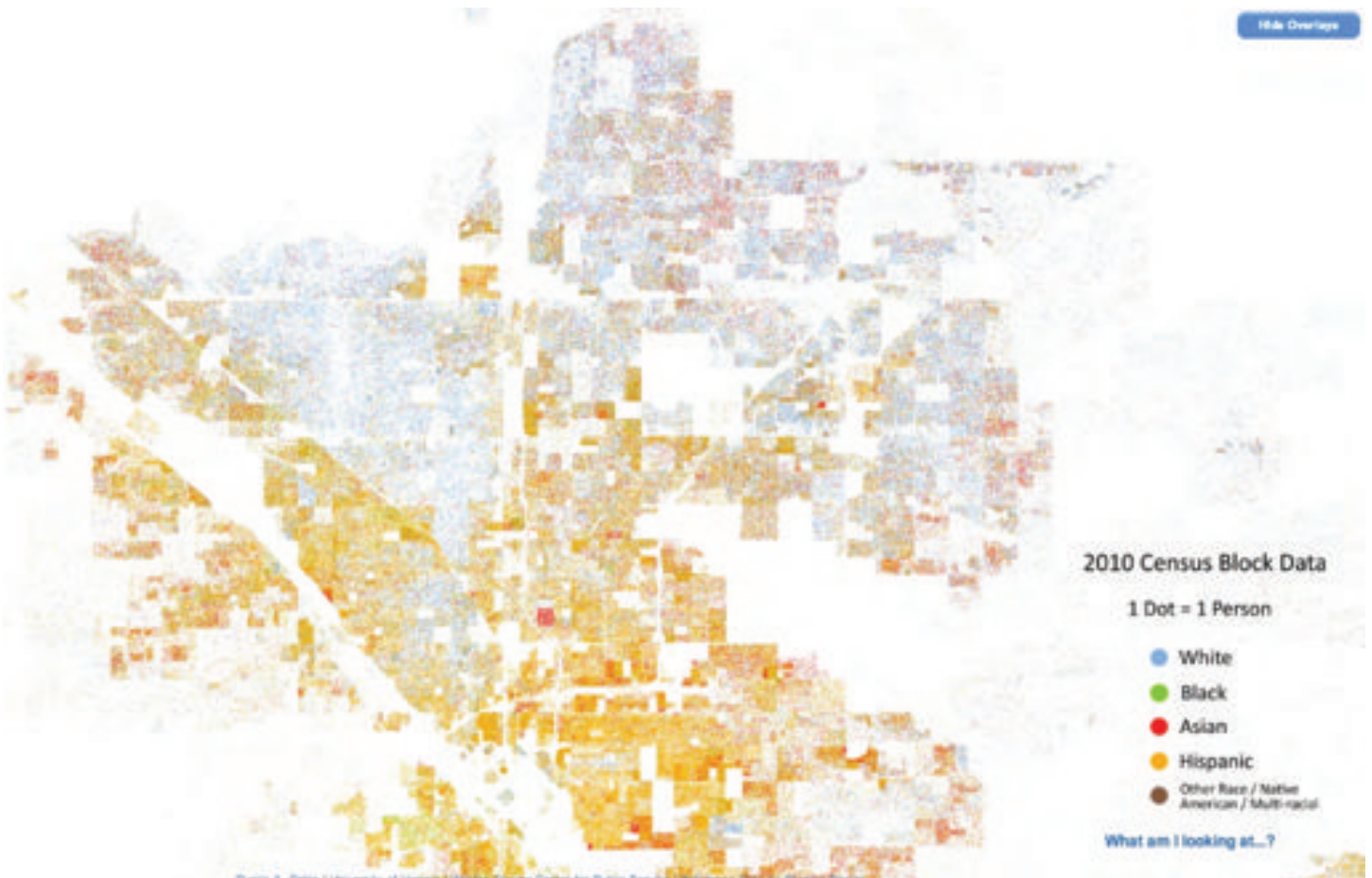

MAP OF THE CONCENTRATION OF POVERTY IN FRESNO

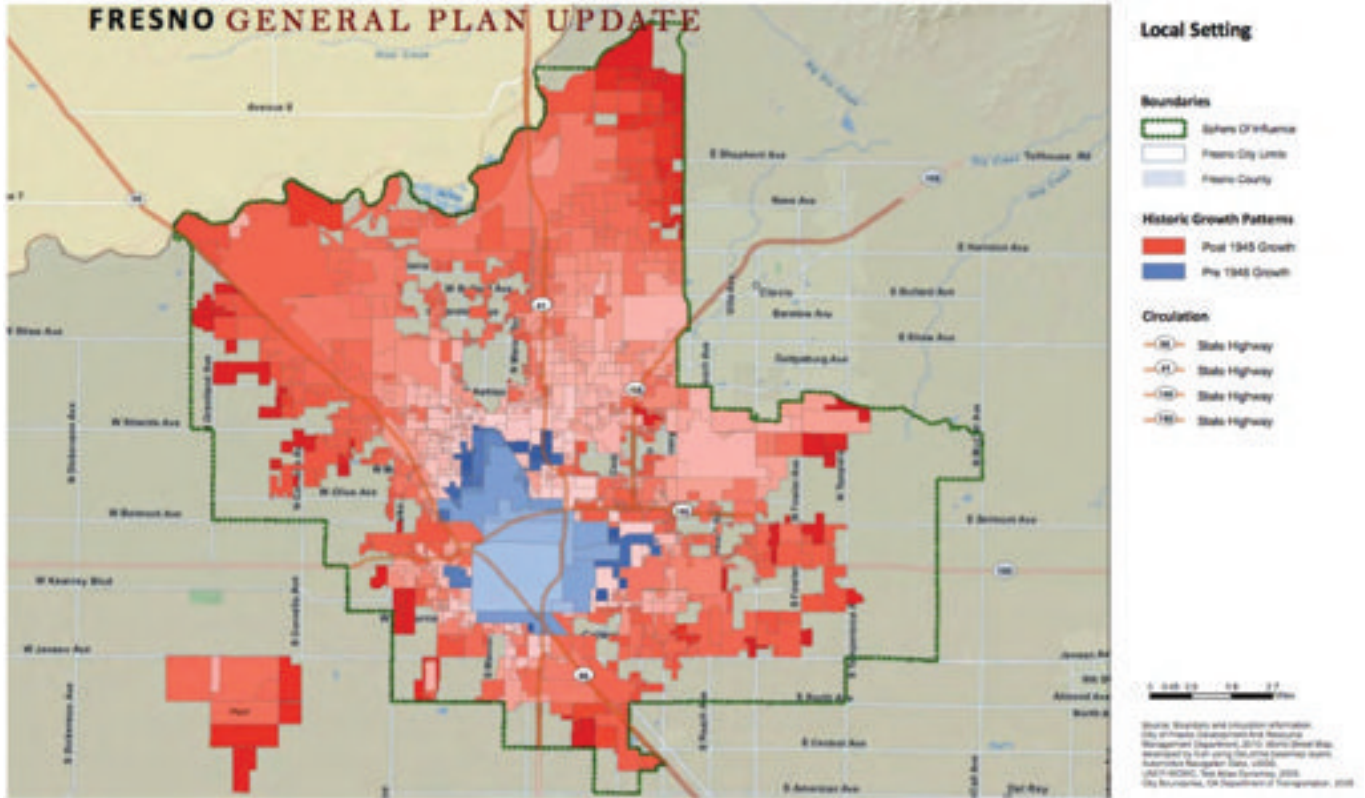


MAP OF RACIAL DIVERSITY IN FRESNO

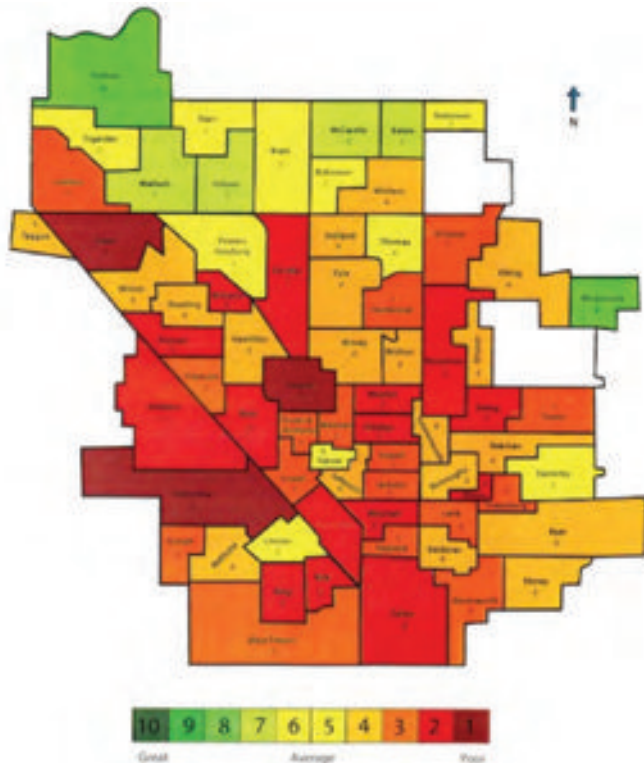

LIFE GROUP GUIDE

Week 1 - The Why

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. **Read verses 13-14.** What have you been delivered from? What have you transformed to? How does this shape our lives and the way we live?
2. **Read verse 9.** What does it mean to be filled with all spiritual wisdom and understanding? Where can you go for wisdom and understanding?
3. **Read verse 10.** What does walking in a manner worthy of the Lord look like? What are practical ways you can bear fruit? Why is it even important to bear fruit?
4. **Read verse 11.** Who is the source of power in your life to obtain spiritual wisdom and produce spiritual fruit?
5. What does this passage have to do with Serve Dei? What lessons can be taken from Paul's words that you can apply to your life group?

INTRODUCTION

Serve Dei has become an annual event at The Well Community Church as we have sought to create marked moments for our people to understand what it means to be the church in every neighborhood. Over the years the event has evolved and changed, moving from a corporate experience that took place in one location to the spreading of smaller pockets of service all over our city. We have observed and celebrated the way God has taken our small offerings and multiplied them for His kingdom and glory. We continue to be convinced of the significance and importance of Serve Dei as it moves us to put our faith into action.

Life Groups function as the primary vehicle of Serve Dei. We have witnessed over the years many groups wrestle with God's Word and seek to discern and decide how to respond to it. Serve Dei pushes on people because it forces them to recognize that to be an authentic disciple of Jesus Christ we must be willing to serve and love others. To simply come to church and not be the church is not a biblical practice, and we want to help people gain awareness and then equip them to respond with obedience to what God is calling them to.

For some Life Groups, this is a new experience for your group and we are excited about the process and what is going to happen to you and through you. For those of you that have participated in Serve Dei in the past, our prayer is that God will continue to stir in your hearts so that you will be compelled to bless, engage and include people. Serve Dei is about Jesus and our willingness to live like him in every pocket of our city.

This guide is designed to help you as a life group navigate through the Serve Dei process. As important as the type of project your group participates in and the impact that it has on others, we are convinced that the process will be just as meaningful for your group. As you pray, plan, and prepare you will want to be aware of what God is shaping in you, drawing you closer to Him and each other along the way.

Read Colossians 1:9-14.

And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God. May you be strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy, giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

PRAYER

Take time to pray for this year's Serve Dei. Pray for the following:

- For wisdom and discernment for your group concerning this year's project or opportunity.
- For lives to be changed and transformed during the process.
- For God to show up in powerful and simple ways as you serve together.
- For other Life Groups and individuals at The Well who will participate this year.
- For our city and valley and the impact that Serve Dei might have on them.
- For Christ to be proclaimed and people to come to faith in Him.

Be thinking of opportunities or projects that might be possible for your Life Group to get involved with this year. Next week you will brainstorm and come up with possible ideas and next steps.



LIFE GROUP GUIDE

Week 2 - The How

INTRODUCTION

The outer ring of the Anatomy of a Disciple is concerned with compassion for the world around you. The biblical word for compassion carries with it the powerful idea of experiencing great affection with action. As we submit ourselves to God and walk in obedience to His word, then we are deeply moved and compelled to respond to others. Serve Dei is an excellent opportunity for you as a Life Group to operate in the ring of Compassion.

There are three different ways for a group to be involved using the outer ring: **INTENTIONAL BLESSING, CULTURALLY ENGAGED** or **INCLUSIVE COMMUNITY**. To be an Intentional Blessing is to use your time, talents, or treasures to bless others, without expecting anything back. To be Culturally Engaged requires that you step into other people's lives and enter in with them on their turf. Inclusive Community is the willingness to hospitably invite people into your world. Each one is unique and distinct, yet each one is a form of compassion.

Your group is going to look for opportunities to bless people, engage with them, and invite them. As you discuss ideas and plan, keep these three in your mind and let them influence your decision-making process. This is going to be an exciting journey for your group as you seek the Lord and walk in response to what He would call you to do.

BRAINSTORM

An easy starting exercise might be to list all three areas on whiteboard or large piece of paper and then brainstorm different ideas that would fit into each area. Ask yourself the following questions as you do.

1. What gifts, skills, or passions do you have as a group? Is there anything that corporately comes to the surface when you consider these?
2. Where do you live, work, and play? Are there any natural areas that your group can come together to serve and care for?

3. What are some areas of town that you know about or care about? Is there a place that your group has wanted to serve in the past but hasn't been able to?

4. As you list ideas, what stands out to you? Is there anything that excites the group? Is there anything that seems compelling for the group to participate in?

As ideas emerge, begin to explore how those ideas could play out for your group as well as who and what would be needed to make it happen. Assign people in the group to make phone calls or secure resources or think through logistics. Let this be a team effort so all the members of the group can participate.

Be flexible through the process as some ideas might seem good originally but as you do some research and investigation it may turn out to not work out. Don't be discouraged, that's why you brainstormed and created a list. Go to Plan B or C and let God use that as well.

FINAL THOUGHTS

1. You will likely end up with more ideas than you can possibly participate in for this year's Serve Dei. Don't worry, just make a list and keep them in mind for the future.
2. If you are having a hard time deciding what project to participate in...give priority to the ones that allow for the most people to join in with.
3. If you have an idea of what sort of project you would like to be involved with but need help making a connection, let The Well know. We have many local partnerships and non-profits in town that we would love to connect you to.
4. If your life group is made up of families, try to find a project that the kids can participate in and invite their friends to join them.
5. All the projects do not need to be labor intensive, if your group needs something that requires less physical effort, then seek one out.
6. This process may generate ideas for individuals in the group that don't fit a group project. That's ok! Encourage each other to pursue some things on your own if God is stirring you.
7. Pray a lot.
8. Have Fun!



LIFE GROUP GUIDE

Week 3 - The Debrief

INTRODUCTION

Serve Dei is over! Can you believe it? We praise God for every good work that was performed by His people. We want to celebrate what God has done all over this city for His glory. It is appropriate and important for you as a Life Group to take time to reflect upon the entire Serve Dei experience. We want to encourage you to take time to reflect upon your experience and make it meaningful by identifying what you learned about God, yourselves, and your group. The reflection process usually follows a sequence of What, So What, and Now What.

WHAT?

Take time to describe what happened during the entire project, who was involved, what was accomplished, what needs were met, etc. You can ask several members of the group to describe what happened with your project or go around in a circle or have each person provide one adjective to describe what happened or was accomplished. Or you can have a group discussion in which you ask the following questions:

1. What were some of the things you noticed?
2. How has this changed or reshaped your understanding of God's Word or the Christian life?

SO WHAT?

The "what?" questions generally lead quickly into the "so what?" questions. This is where you want to ask what thoughts, feelings, or lessons learned came from your project. You may want to ask some of the following questions:

1. What do you know now that you didn't know before?
2. What attitudes and feelings do you have about the experience that you didn't have before?

3. What part of this experience was most valuable for you? For your group?
4. What do you think you will remember or retain in others ways after the experience?
5. How have you contributed to this group?

NOW WHAT?

Serve Dei is designed to be more than a one-day experience in that it would become a lifestyle for disciples of Jesus Christ. The Now What questions are to help you and your group consider what's next or continuing steps that are necessary for your group. You may want to ask some of the following questions:

1. What do you think you will remember or retain in other ways after the experience?
2. How has this change or reshaped your understanding of God's Word or the Christian life?
3. What are some things you appreciate about the members of this group?
4. What changes would you suggest for future group experiences?
5. Where does the group go from here?

FINAL THOUGHTS

It might be appropriate for you to follow up with the organization or people that you served during the project. Let them reflect upon the experience and see if there is any information that would be helpful to your group both now and in the future. Set a time to meet or even to do another serve project down the road.

Tell your story. It is good to share what happened and how God moved with other people. This may include family, other members of The Well, or friends and neighbors. If you have pictures or videos from the experience, post them online as a way of celebrating what God did. The Well Community Church would love to hear your stories so send an email with pictures and information to your Campus Pastor.

A final prayer for all of us:

“May WE be strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy, giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified US to share in the inheritance of the saints in light.”

MATCHING FUNDS REQUESTS

The Well is committed to partner with you and provide you the support you need to see your service project through.

When you fill out the Serve Dei Project Form you will see a section where you can request matching funds for your project. As your group raises funds for your project we would like to match the amount you raise up to \$500.00. We think this really gives everyone the opportunity to put some "skin in the game" as well as "equipping the saints to do the work of the ministry."

All requests will go through their Campus Pastor and Missions Director for evaluation. Upon approval, a Life Group Leader will be contacted and a check will be mailed to the home of the Life Group Leader. Please allow for a 2 week turnaround time for the check.

POTENTIAL SERVE DEI PROJECTS

READING AND BEYOND

We would love to have help with a Spring cleaning day at our main center in Southeast Fresno, near the corner of Maple and Butler. Tasks would include: sweeping, weeding, raking, mopping, painting, planting, trash pick-up, etc. - *50-60 People (All Ages)*

EVERY NEIGHBORHOOD PARTNERSHIP

Volunteers for kids camps, clean up projects, graffiti abatements, yard cleanups. - *Multiple Life Groups*

PREGNANCY CARE CENTER

We would love your assistance in "flyering" (Is that even a real verb?) the neighborhood near the Clovis site to advertise our Mobile Unit Location. - *Unlimited (All Ages)*

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES

The service projects would be preparing a meal for our families and sorting and stocking our food pantries. - *15 People (All Ages)*

POVERELLO HOUSE

Help with food prep, sack lunches, serving breakfast (from 8:30-10am), cleanup, warehouse/sorting donations of canned food, making up grocery food bags, serving lunch (from 11:30-1pm) and giving out bag dinners. - *5-10 people from 8:30-10am & 5-10 people from 11:30-1pm (All Ages)*

TREE FRESNO

Planting, tree pruning, street tree inventory, underbrush removal, inventory tools and supplies, inventory event supplies, inventory materials in storage. - *4 to 80 People (All Ages)*

CITY WITHOUT ORPHANS

We would have church members come and provide a fun evening for kids in foster care, or adopted children, while their parent/s go on a date or take some time for themselves. It is providing a short respite. I would think 2 hours would be ideal for a Sunday evening before school starts. All the children would be pre-registered and then dropped off at the place chosen for the event (a church would be ideal). The volunteers can assist with crafts, games and food. City Without Orphans can provide the materials/food/children, but we would need to have the childcare workers and possibly a location. - *20 People (All Ages)*

NEIGHBORHOOD THRIFT

We need volunteers to hand out flyers in a neighborhood for Neighborhood Thrift. We will also need volunteers to assist with breaking down mattresses at our distribution center. The flyering will require at least 50 volunteers while the mattress breakdown will need about 20. This will require heavy labor. - *No children*

PROJECT LINUS

We have a project that would include making no sew fleece blankets for children. - *Minimum 10 people*

AMERICAN RED CROSS

We will be cavassing a neighborhood in here in Fresno, so we would need people who can do a lot of walking. - *Minimum 20 people*

VALLEY TEEN RANCH

We need some help with basic construction at our Transitional Living Home and at the ranch, in the Madera Ranchos area. - *10-15 people*

HINDS HOSPICE

At the Hospice Home volunteers can assist with the following outside of the home. Including things like cleaning windows, sweeping the porches and walkways, wiping down the metal tables and chairs on patio and removing cobwebs. - *10 people maximum*

FRESNO/MADERA YOUTH FOR CHRIST

We will do a major "spring cleaning" on our headquarters/ ministry center. Throwing out junk, possibly running a garage sale to raise money; painting, cleaning floors and carpets, organizing; we will power-wash our roof if we have capable adults to walk on our flat roof and use the washer; there are also some minor carpentry jobs like installing thresholds, possibly at that time we will need some minor construction help on a remodel project. Lots of options based on the help available. - *20 people maximum*

ADDITIONAL SUPPLIES

If you are in need of any additional supplies for your project, Every Neighborhood Partnership is willing to provide you with tools and other materials that may be helpful for your group. You can request supplies on the Serve Dei Project Form.
